Action plan



Starting on Friday, 28th of March, we will....

- Send an online survey: needs of the neighbourhood + bus, transportation, challenges, safety, green place
- Have a meeting with some stakeholders, analysis of survey results
- Have a meeting with citizens
 - Discussions
 - What do you need to use the bus
 - Obstacles to go from A to B
 - What would make you use your car less
 - Access
 - Safety
 - Having a discussion
 - Role play: **how would you adapt your lifestyle in the neighborhood if there were no cars?**
- Analyse the results of the discussion
- Take the results of the analysis and have an inspiration session that will hopefully end up with a conclusion
- Set up a follow up => owners for every action + a letter, a website, some other methods (a survey every 6 months)

being a role play = team building

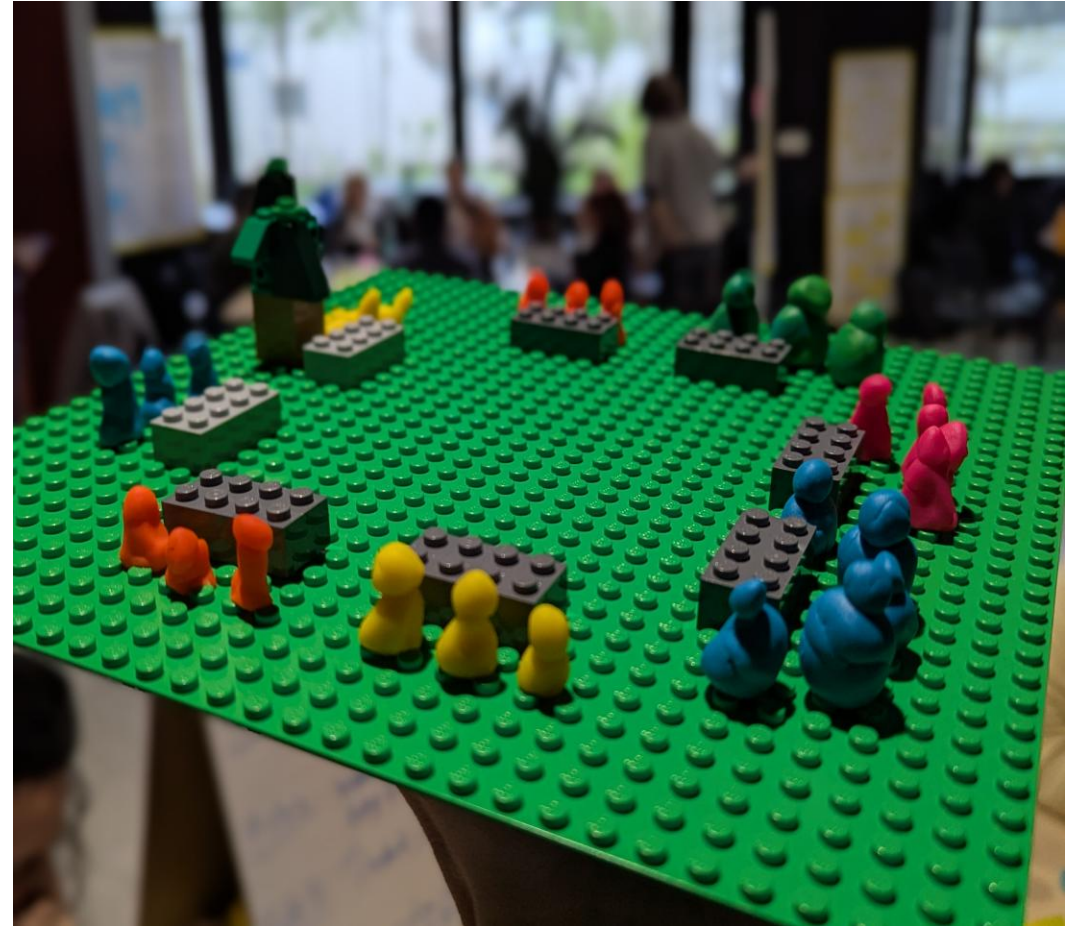
